The City of Haarlem

Haarlem was granted the city status in 1245, although the first city walls were not built until 1270. Haarlem is located on the river Spaarne, giving it's nickname *Spaarnestad* (Spaarne city). It is situated about 20 km (12 mi) west of Amsterdam and near the coastal dunes. Haarlem has been the historical centre of the tulip bulb-growing district for centuries and bears it's other nickname *Bloemenstad* (Flower city) for this reason.
